

# Behaviour Policy Addendum

## Appendix 1: COVID-19

**Based on current guidelines from the Government, this appendix covers behavioural expectations during COVID-19.**

*'My children, our love should not be just words and talk; it must be true love, which shows itself in action.'*

1 John 3:18

In these challenging and unprecedented times, the behaviour as set out in the main body of the policy is still expected at all times.

Our rules of **Ready, Respectful, Safe** still apply.

At part of the risk assessment process for reopening, it has been necessary to develop measures in line with government guidance regarding social distancing, hand washing, hygiene and test, track and trace.

In order to keep our school community safe, we expect everybody to:

- Follow the latest government guidance around self-isolation on the development of symptoms within the household
- Where anyone within the household develops symptoms of Covid-19, they should not send their child to school and follow the strict 14 day self-isolation
- On result of a positive test for coronavirus, you must share information promptly with the NHS test and trace service
- On the development of symptoms take a test and report the result to the school
- A positive result will result in the 'Bubble' self-isolating for 14 days
- Where consent is withheld for testing by either parent or child, the assumption will be made that the test would return positive and 'Bubble' will self-isolate for 14 days
- Where children develop symptoms, parents are expected to collect their child as quickly as possible and follow the 14 day self-isolation rules
- Follow strict social distancing rules whilst on the school site.
- Not enter the school building unless given permission to do so by the Headteacher
- Provide children with a clean set of clothing each day they are at school
- Only attend the school site if a school place has been allocated
- Only one parent to attend the school site at drop off and pick up, siblings should not attend the school site

For children attending the school site they will be expected to:

- Follow instructions the first time they are given which is a matter of safety for all
- Make every attempt to follow the rules on social distancing within the school site
- Stay in the 'Bubble' in which they are placed and not enter another
- Following the hygiene expectations as set out by Public Health England in response to hand washing and good respiratory hygiene
- Only to use the equipment that is allocated personally to them

Not following any of the expectations above will result in the immediate withdrawal of the pupils, parents will be expected to collect and they will be unable to return until such time that the expectations can be followed.
